In 2022, he co-directed *Prince Panthère* at the Petit Théâtre de Sherbrooke. He also teaches philosophy for children at the Haute École Pédagogique de Namur, in Belgium.

Their aim is to engage young spectators through imaginative storytelling, laughter, and reflection. With inventive scenography and unique themes, the company has gained a strong reputation in Quebec and internationally. Over 350 artists and craftspeople have performed more than 5,000 shows across four continents, reaching 1.3 million spectators. Founded in 1973 by Francine Saint-Aubin, led by Artistic Director André Laliberté, Théâtre de l'Œil has created 28 original productions.

BIOGRAPHIES

Fanny Britt a playwright and author, has received accolades for her works including Couche avec moi (c'est l'hiver) and Jane, le renard et moi. She is a recipient of the Governor General's Literary Award and has written essays on motherhood. Fanny has also translated and adapted numerous plays and novels. Her second novel, Faire les sucres, won the Governor General's Literary Award in 2021.

Director of around thirty shows, performer in more than fifty theatrical creations and productions, and author of numerous works, **Marie-Josée Bastien** is an artist devoted entirely to theatre. Having taken over as artistic director of the Théâtre Stratégie Parking (TNP) in 2016, after having taken charge of

the Théâtre Les Enfants Terribles, she teaches in different theatre schools in the province. *176 steps*, marks her first co-directing experience for the Théâtre de l'Œil, alongside Simon Boudreault.

In addition to being an author and director, **Simon Boudreault** is a recognized actor and improviser. He attended the National Improvisation League for almost 10 years and won numerous awards. He took the helm of artistic direction of the Théâtre de l'Œil in 2020, continuing with the work of André Laliberté.



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



With great confidence in the genuine curiosity and intelligence of children, Mammifères conceives its artistic events on stage, in museums or elsewhere, as a theatre of materials that appeals to the senses, an art that doesn't hesitate to shake up life's conformisms and prejudices taken for granted.

BIOGRAPHIES

Author, director, performer, musician, and visual artist, a versatile artist with an unbridled poetic streak, **Karine Sauvé** creates using plastic and sound materials. A graduate of the DESS in in contemporary puppet theatre at UQÀM, she brings her creations to the stage in a performative style that features songs, metamorphoses, and festive rituals. *Les Grands-Mères Mortes*, the first show of the Mammifères company she founded in 2013, was acclaimed by audiences and critics. Her sensitive approach to voice, words, and images has led her to collaborate with artists from different disciplines. She recently wrote and directed directed *Le Potager* with Érika Tremblay-Roy, and collaborates as a singer-performer in Système Kangourou's *Bermudes (dérive)* (2022). She co-created and performed *Le spectacle de l'arbre* (2008-2013) with Nathalie Derome.

David Paquet graduated from the National Theatre School of Canada's in 2006. His plays include *Porcupine*, 2h14, Appels Entrants Illimités, Le Brasier, The Shoe, and The Weight of Ants, as well as Papiers Mâchés and Le Voilier (manifeste du fragile), two poetic stand-up solos which he performs himself. His award-winning work has been presented in over a dozen in Europe and North America. In addition to his career as an author, he regularly accompanies other creators as a dramaturge and trainer, including for the National Theatre School of Canada, the Association des théâtres francophones du Canada, and the Centre des auteurs dramatiques. He co-wrote the text of Les Grands-Mères Mortes with Karine Sauvé.

Guilmaine has been developing a practice as a scenic author tinged with performance, visual installation, and relational art. With the interdisciplinary company Système Kangourou, which she co-founded in 2006 with Claudine Robillard, she creates shows rooted in the encounter between performers and spectators. Whether with Non Finito (2017), Le pouvoir expliqué à ceux qui l'exercent (sur moi) (2019) or Bermudes (dérive) (2021), she is interested in the presence of non-actors on stage, sharing their own narratives at the heart of scores woven from performative actions and plurivocal images. Holder of a master's degree in theatre and another in literature. Anne-Marie is interested in approaches rooted in reality.

Co-directed by Sylvain Scott and Benoît Vermeulen, Le Clou actively combine textual, formal, and design elements through creative exploration. Designed to meet the needs of primary and secondary school teachers and students, it introduces young people to the particularities of the theatrical genre through an experience aimed at appreciating an audio work and reinvesting it in the classroom. 



ÉRIKA TREMBLAY-ROY


